

Premillennialism Lesson #3

In this lesson we will be

1st looking first at O.T. scriptures that indicate what God said regarding the Kingdom (Ruler) that He would sit on the Throne of David and

2nd looking to the N.T. to see what Jesus says regarding the Kingdom

3rd we will investigate the epistles and see what the Apostles thought regarding the coming Kingdom or King.

4th we will investigate Acts 2 and see what was actually preached regarding the kingdom (note we will see that the “kingdom” or “king” was preached and established! The kingdom was the subject, not the church.)

Read the following scriptures. Were the Jews of Jesus’ day looking forward to the coming of the Messiah, King to rule them as David had done? (One of his descendants?)

Psalms 132:11 The LORD has sworn in truth to David;
He will not turn from it:
"I will set upon your throne the fruit of your body.

Isaiah 9:7 Of the increase of His government and peace
There will be no end,
Upon the throne of David and over His kingdom,
To order it and establish it with judgment and justice
From that time forward, even forever.
The zeal of the LORD of hosts will perform this.

Isaiah 16:5 In mercy the throne will be established;
And One will sit on it in truth, in the tabernacle of David,
Judging and seeking justice and hastening righteousness."
