

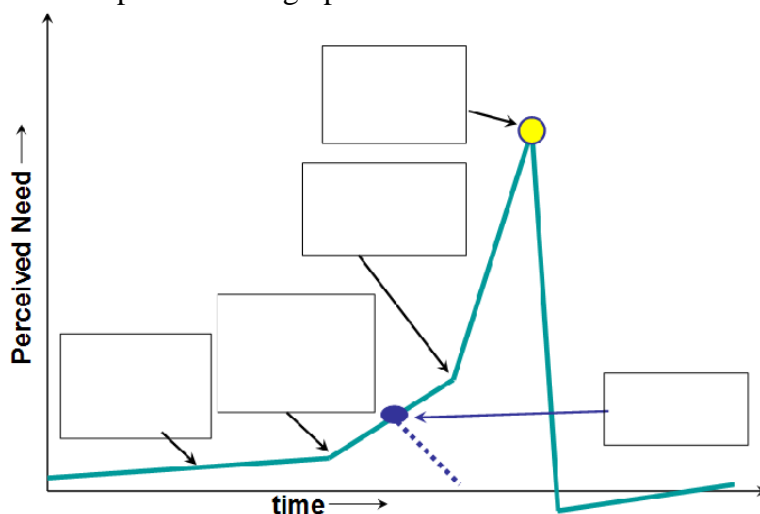
Living in the World – Review Quiz
